And because this program is a collaborative effort with the Anne Arundel County Public School System, we stay focused on the primary objective of accelerating student performance to a level necessary to reach achievement standards aligned with the Maryland Core Learning Goals.

Located within Bates Middle School, the High Road Academy allows students to share the public school's curriculum, materials, equipment, and amenities, yet our targeted research-based interventions have been customized to advance the reading, writing, and math skills of challenged students, along with their ability to better understand and master content. Ultimately, we are committed to building confidence and competence in every one of our students, so we provide them with consistent and structured instruction in deficit areas and we teach them how to become independent learners in the general education setting.
